Report Highlights:

On November 9, Burma published new negative import lists that indicate the products required to have import licenses with notification 18/2021, which included apples, grapes, oranges, pears and butter and milk products.

Report High light:

On November 9, Burma published new negative import lists that indicate the products required to have import licenses with notification 18/2021, which included apples, grapes, oranges, pears, and butter and milk products.

Background

Burma's Ministry of Commerce usually amends the import negative lists frequently based on the requirements and the country's economic situation. Recently, to support the country's economic recovery in the aftermath of COVID-19, to ensure the country's systematic import and export proceedures, and to control the use of foreign currency for the import of goods, Burma published new negative lists by notification 18/2021 on November 9, 2021. This notification is only the first and more lists will be published step by step for the importers to prepare for the conversion of these product lines into the import licensing system. According the 2017 Custom Tariff of Myanmar, 1,428 tariff lines with 6-digit HS code or 3,070 tariff lines with HS code 10-digits that were previously outside the list are now included in the import negative list by this notification. The new list includes electronic devices, some foods, cosmetics and consumer products, paper and paperboard, and goods related to construction. The lists of additional commodities by chapter can be seen in Table 1 of the Annex where the unofficial translated announcement and food items are highlighted.

This notification will go into effect on January 1, 2022 for both maritime trade and land trade including border trade. Together with the previous notification 68/2021, a total of 7,001 tariff lines are required to apply import licenses, which is about 62 percent of total tariff lines according to the HS code in the 2017 Custom Tariff of Myanmar. For food items, 93 percent of total food tariff lines are required to apply an import license.

What Does This Mean for U.S. Products?

U.S. exports, such as consumer-oriented products, meat and meat products, wine, juice and beverages, soymeal, and DDGS, are required to have an import license already. However, four new fruits were added to the list that previously did not need an import license: apples, oranges, grapes, and pears.

Some milk and milk products, such as buttermilk, curdled milk and cream, yogurt, butter and other fats and oils derived from milk, dairy spreads, cheese, and curd, as well as sausages and similar products of meat, meat offal, and blood are now required to apply an import license.

Wheat grains are still exempted from the import license but it could be included in future notifications as the Ministry of Commerce confirmed in this announcement that it will publish additional lists in tranches. The new notification does not impact the United States' largest export, soymeal, which already needs to apply an import license, but negatively effects on importation of four major fruits, apples, oranges, pears and grapes. Burma is currently importing those fruits from Thailand due to difficulties booking direct vessels from the United States to Burma.

Post conclusion

The import procedures could be delayed due to several applications by importers at the same time and the shortage of government staff at departments involved with imports during the country's current situation. This will likely increase expenses for importers. Post will track the additional announcements and update accordingly.

Annex 1: Unofficial translation of original notification 18/2021

Republic of the Union of Myanmar Ministry of Commence Department of Trade

Announcement for Export/ Import Letter no. 18/2021

Date: 9 November 2021

Subject: Announcement of Negative list for import subject to apply import license

- 1. In order to remedy negative economic impacts aftermath of Covid -19, to ensure the systematic importation, and to adjust the utilization of foreign currency for the import of goods, some goods will be importing with the license system.
- 2. In the conversion of such products lines into license system, the list required import license will be classified and published step by step for the importers to ensure the preparation in advanced.
- 3. As for phase 1, electronic goods, some food stuffs, cosmetics, consumer goods, paper products, and construction materials by the 2017 Custom Tariff of Myanmar, (1, 1,428 tariff lines with 6-digit HS code or 3,070 tariff lines with HS code 10-digits that are previously outside the list are required import license starting from 1 January 2022.
- 4. Not only the new list prescribed in the above paragraph (3) but also (3, 931) tariff lines (HS 10-digit level) which are provided in the list published through the Notification No.68/2020 (https://myanmartradeportal.gov.mm/en/legal/317) shall be subject to import license starting from 1 January, 2022. All products listed in the annex of this Notification will be allowed into Myanmar by maritime trade, air freight and border trade, after obtaining the import license from the Department of Trade in line with prescribed laws, rules, and regulations.
- 5. Goods listed in paragraph (3) above required an import license, will be published according to export and import law.
